## Fewer guests in Haiti lead to bigger challenges

Even though life has generally returned to normal, the protests that consumed life in Haiti in February are still having an impact on the country and on the St. Joseph Family. Following the 10 days of riots that shut down the country in mid-February the US State Department issued a warning against travel to Haiti. This has led to many groups cancelling trips to Haiti.

One of the ways the SJF contributes to its budget every year is through hosting groups at the Wings Welcome Center and the SJ Welcome Center.

Besides the benefit of allowing guests to see the wonderful work being done at the SJF missions first-hand, the Welcome Centers generate some necessary income to help support the missions.

However, the warning by the US State Department has caused many groups with plans to come to Haiti and stay with the SJF to cancel, and will likely prevent future groups from even considering a trip. The SJF has had just two guests since the first week in February and only two reservations pending for the next five months. We have no idea

when the warning level will go back down or when groups will start planning on traveling to Haiti again.

At the same time as income is down because of guest cancellations, the economic situation that led to the protests in February continues to deteriorate which is causing the value of Haitian currency to plummet and for costs to skyrocket. This puts the SJF in a dangerous position with less money coming in and more money going out.

To help make up some of the shortfall and deal with the rising prices we are asking you to consider a special "Virtual Guest House" donation. This challenge for donations of \$50 is to represent one night of guest lodging in Haiti. A generous donor to Friends of SJF has pledged to match all "Virtual Guest House" donations up to \$5,000, so your donation will go twice as far.

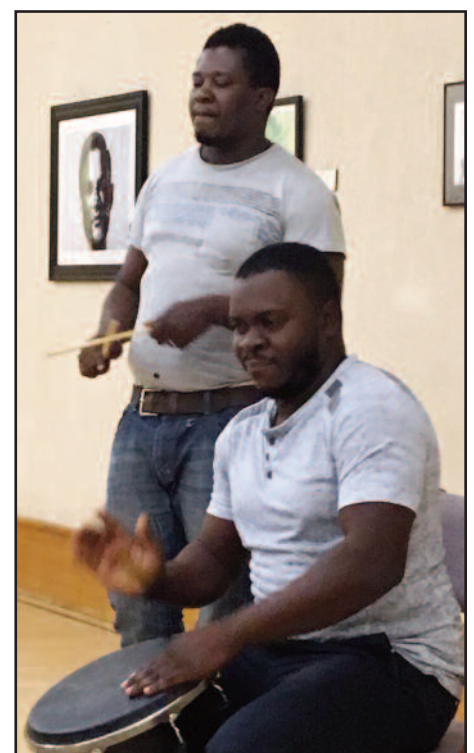

## **SJF's new payroll system brings new opportunities**

Friends of SJF joins the St. Joseph Family in recognizing that one of the things we are most proud of are the amazing employees of the St. Joseph Family.

Each day, even during protests, severe weather and other challenges, the SJF employees come to work to make sure the children and ministries are taken care of. Despite their buying power taking a hit with the crashing economy they never complained or demanded more money (which they knew the SJF didn't have).

Because of their faith and loyalty the SJF took a big step in March. It is a step that has been talked about and planned for a long time but one that comes at a cost; and it causes the SJF and its mission partners to take a leap of faith.

Up until March the payroll for the SJF has always been in cash. This was risky, for both the SJF and the employees. Large amounts of cash had to be transported between the missions. As the prices increased but the pay levels did not, the employees took the economic hit.

With the new payroll system, the employees are paid by check, in US funds. This means less risk for the SJF be-

cause large sums of money don't have to be transported. It allows the employees to deal with the fluctuating exchange rate and have more Haitian currency to take home at the end of the day.

With the move to the pay-by-check system, the SJF also enrolled in two government programs that will assist the employees. Now both the employees and the SJF pay into a Social Security-like system and a government health care system, and each of the employees have an account with both programs. All the employees also received slight raises to help them cover their cost of both programs and to reward them for their loyalty and work.

The SJF is still working out all the logistics of the new system, but it is an exciting step forward for everyone. It does come at a cost though, as it caused the yearly budget for wages to increase by 33% to cover the increased wages and taxes. The St. Joseph Family and its mission partners, including Friends of SJF, are being challenged to bring in more donations and income to cover the increased cost, but all are committed to taking care of both the SJF missions and the people who serve there.

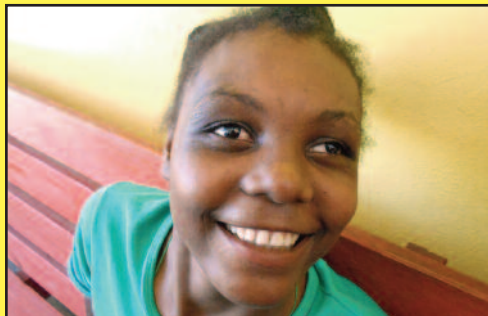
